It is very sad to cancel this occasion," remarked Executive Director Thomas McGregor. "We still wish to host a celebration and recognize our annual youth champion award, but once it makes sense to carry forward."

Event planners have not yet determined a new date for the celebration. "I know our students and faculty look forward to this event every year because the funds raised go to their specially designated classroom projects," shared Principal Brandy Osborn. "I hope we can reschedule, or find a new way, to have our donors still enrich our students' lives."
